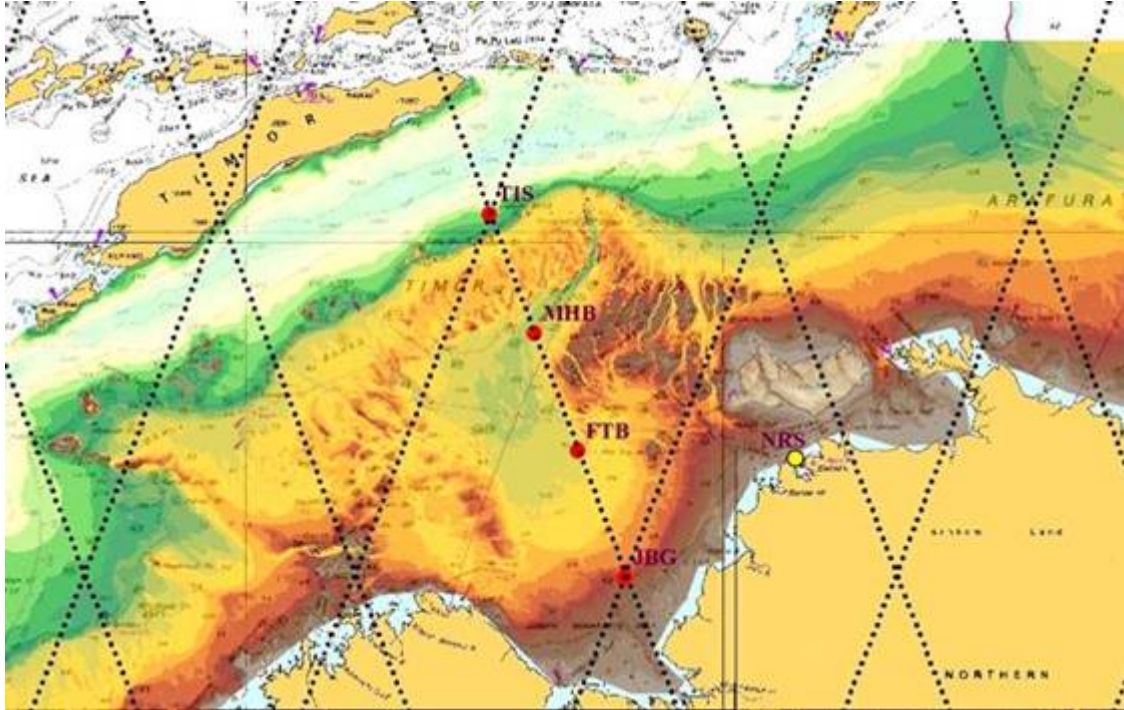
New Deployments

This section will list any new Facility deployments in the previous month

Argo Floats – 7 Argo floats were deployed from the RV *Kaharoa* between the 16-27th of June and 3 Argo floats were also deployed from the *Vega Gotland* between the 11-12th of July.

Ocean gliders – one Slocum glider was deployed off the coast of Perth on the 28th June.

National Mooring Network – The Indonesian Through Flow Shelf Transect Moorings (the array is comprised of four moorings extending from the Timor Trough to Joseph Bonaparte Gulf) were deployed on 30 June on the Research Vessel *Solander*. This is an important first step in the enhanced monitoring of northern Australian waters with the additional funds IMOS received from the Education Investment Fund (EIF).

The Darwin National Reference Station was also upgraded to provide real time data for currents and water quality.

Wireless Sensor Networks –Orpheus Island weather station and sensor float data are available.

Satellite Remote Sensing - High-resolution (<10km) Sea Surface Temperature (GHRSSST 14 day mosaic product) data is now available, with the capability to create an animation for a requested period.
